

Paddington's Party Key Fact Sheet - Science

There are 4 seasons in the UK: spring, summer, autumn and winter.

Spring

It starts to get a little bit warmer but there are still rain and clouds.

Summer

The hottest time of the year. There is usually sunshine with generally dry weather.

Autumn

It begins to get colder. It becomes more cloudy and there will be more rainy days.

Winter

The coldest time of year. There is usually a lot of cloud, wind and rain. Sometimes there is snow, ice and frost.

In summer, there is more daylight; the days appear longer and the nights are shorter.

In winter, there is less daylight; the nights are longer and the days appear shorter.

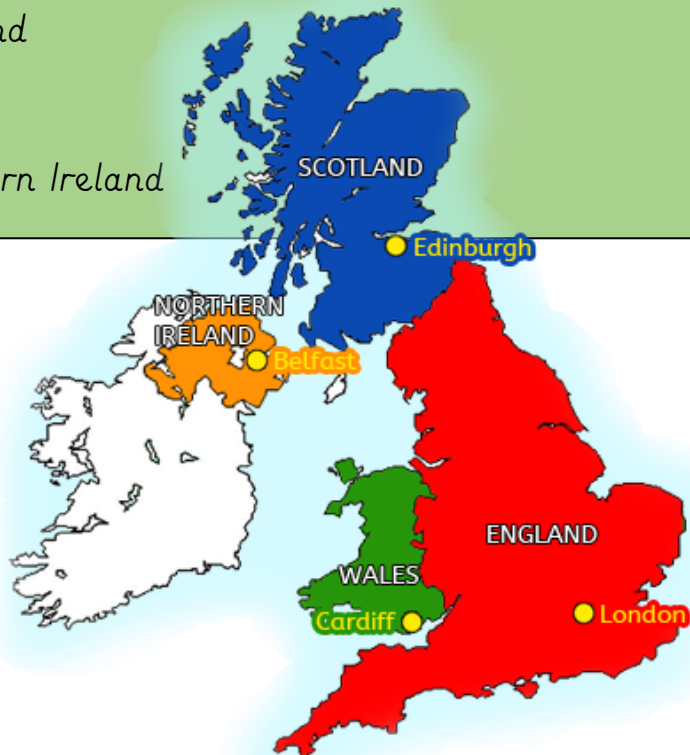
The United Kingdom is often referred to as the UK. It is made up of 4 countries:

England - London

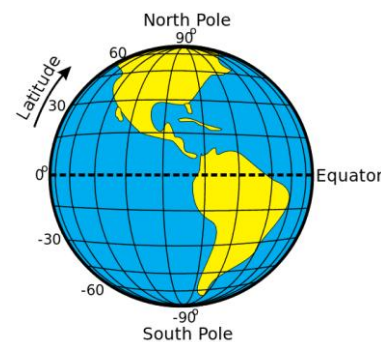
Scotland - Edinburgh

Key Vocabulary

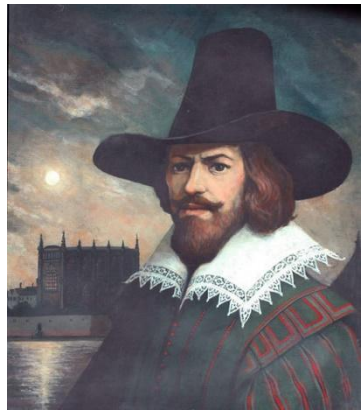
United Kingdom (UK)	The UK includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
capital city	The city where the government sits for each country.
London	The capital city of England.
Equator	The equator is an imaginary line that runs around the centre of the Earth at equal distance between the North and South Poles.
village	A small settlement with a small population.
town	A larger settlement with a larger population than a village.
city	A huge settlement with a big population.



The equator runs around the middle of the Earth. Countries which are closer to the Equator are hotter and countries further away (like the North and South Pole) are colder.

House of Parliament	The building in London where the Prime Minister and people who run our country work.
gunpowder	An explosive, like fireworks.
war	When people from different countries fight. There have been 2 main wars: WW1 and WW2.
