A habitat provides food, water and shelter for a living thing.

Living things are suited to the habitats that they live in.



Plants and animals that live in a habitat could include badgers, whales, coral and oak trees.

Plants and animals that live in a microhabitat could include woodlice, ants and clover. We might use a magnifying glass to find these plants or animals. A magnifying glass helps to make things appear bigger.

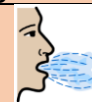


Something that has never been alive is a non-living thing. They do not require food, water or air.

Key Vocabulary

Living	Something that is alive and needs food, water and air.
Dead	Dead things used to be alive and needed food, water and air to live.
Habitat	The natural home of a plant or animal.
Environment	The surroundings and conditions of an area.
Magnifying glass	A piece of glass or plastic that helps us view smaller things.
Shelter	A place that gives protection against the weather or danger.
Microhabitat	A smaller part of the bigger habitat that animals lives in.

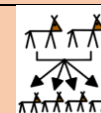

Human features	Something that is built by humans and would not have existed in nature without humans.
Physical features	Something that is natural and that has existed in nature without humans.
Country	Land that is controlled by a single government.
Continents	Earth is divided up into seven large masses of land called continents. These are Africa, Antarctica, Australia, Europe, Asia, South America and North America.
Globe	The round map of the world.
Map	A picture or drawing of places.
Atlas	A book containing lots of maps.

Key Vocabulary

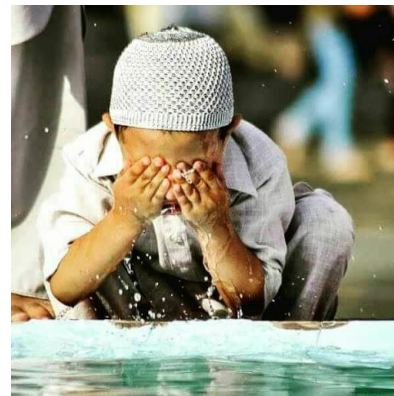
Quay	A stone or metal platform next to water that is used to help load or unload ships.
Artefact	An object that is made by a human, such as pieces of art or tools, that are of historical or cultural interest.
Harbour	A place, near the coast, where boats and animals can shelter from rough waves.
Smuggler	Someone who sneaks goods into places where they shouldn't.
Importing	Bring in goods from another country.
Pirate	A person who attacks and steals from ships.
Primary sources	Something from the time actual time that it happened.
Secondary sources	A book, article or other source made after an event using primary sources.
Taxes	Money people have to pay to the government.

Islam

Focus: How do Muslims show commitment?

- Most Muslims make the commitment to pray 5 times a day.
- The times of prayer are spread throughout the day to maintain their connection to Allah.
- Generally, it will be sunrise, mid-afternoon, late afternoon, sunset and at night.



Many Muslims complete the ritual act of Wudu. This helps them prepare to talk to Allah.

Key Vocabulary

Wudu	Ritual washing to get ready for prayer and worship.
praying	When people talk to their God (Allah for Muslims).
ritual	A special set of actions and words.
commitment	Another word for promise.

To help them to learn about being a good Muslim, most will listen to, or read from the Qur'an. This is a very special and holy book.
