YEAR TWO TOPIC NEWSLETTER



Autumn Term 2023 Dazzling Dahl



During our new topic, the children will be focussing on a range of books written by Roald Dahl, and will look closely at the illustrations by Quentin Blake that feature throughout. In literacy, the children will begin by studying the story of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' and will plan and write character descriptions, a letter, riddles about other characters in the story, and even invent their own sweet! After this, they will move onto the story of 'Matilda'. During our Dazzling Dahl coffee morning, you will have the opportunity to come in and read the wonderful writing that the children have produced. During art lessons, the children will study the work of Quentin Blake before sketching their own Roald Dahl inspired character which will be painted with watercolours. In design and technology lessons, the children will propose a healthier alternative to Willy Wonka's chocolates and sweets by creating their own super smoothies. In science, the children will take part in a number of experiments where they will test the suitability of different materials, making links to the material's properties. In maths, the children will look at measurements including mass, temperature, length, height, volume and capacity. They will then move onto recalling the values of coins and notes before studying the properties of 2D shapes.

Home Learning Activity

For the children's home learning, we would like them to choose their favourite Roald Dahl story and prepare a short presentation explaining why it is their favourite of his stories. They should use evidence from what they have read in books. We would like the children to present their home learning in their own way, e.g. a poster / paragraphs/ a mind map etc. They will then have the opportunity to share their presentation in class. Please can your child bring their home learning into school by Monday 4th December 2023.

P.E. — Gymnastics and Outdoor Games

The focus for the children's work in gymnastics will be developing body control, balance and working on linking movements together.

In outdoor games, we follow a scheme called 'Get Set 4 PE' which is fully aligned to the National Curriculum and Ofsted requirements. This half-term, we will focus on sending and receiving, as well as teamwork.

In Religion and Worldviews, the children will continue to learn about Christianity, specifically why most Christians believe God gave Jesus to the world and how different faiths have different celebrations.
