As the end of 2023 is fast approaching, we would like to take this opportunity to say how wonderful it has been working with your children; welcoming them into school every morning and seeing their happy faces throughout the day.

Pastoral care is here for every child. Our aim is to help all of the children feel settled, happy and secure as they progress through school. Please don't hesitate to get in touch if you feel your child has any worries, needs reassurance or support. We are always happy to help.

As Christmas approaches, and our children become more excited, we would like to take some time to think about some of our families who may not be as fortunate as others, even more so, due to the current cost of living crisis.

As the cost of living increases, it is important to be aware of the benefits, payments and support options available to you. There are local and national schemes that can help you with rent, food, energy and more:

Cost of living support

The government has a national cost of living hub which can be found at <u>Cost of Living Payments 2023 to 2024 - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> .

Household Support Fund 3

This funding is to support residents in BCP with the cost of living situation around keeping warm, reducing energy bills and accessing food across the winter. More information can be found here https://www.gov.uk/cost-living-help-local-council.

Citizens Advice BCP

In addition to the funding provided to schools for the flexible food vouchers, residents can also apply for short term financial help in the form of food and/or energy vouchers through Citizen's Advice BCP Home - Citizens Advice Bournemouth Christchurch & Poole (citizensadvicebcp.org.uk).

Energy Advice
